

Statement on Deforestation

Ingredion recognizes that deforestation and the conversion of natural ecosystems contribute significantly to climate change, biodiversity loss, and adverse social impacts on communities that depend on forests and other natural landscapes. We are committed to the sustainable management of natural resources and support global efforts to halt and reverse deforestation throughout our value chain.

Ingredion continually evaluates actual and potential deforestation risks within our operations and supply chain. While many of the forest-risk commodities identified by external frameworks are not directly applicable to our business operations, we recognize that timber-based materials used for energy applications may present potential exposure while representing less than 5% of our global energy supply.

We believe the biggest risk for deforestation in our supply chain comes from our agricultural suppliers. To that end, Ingredion is a member of the Sustainable Agriculture Initiative Platform (SAI Platform), which enables us to collaborate with customers, growers, and non-government organizations (NGOs) to assess potential risks in our supply chain. We utilize the SAI Platform's Farm Sustainability Assessment (FSA) to evaluate the farms from which we source agricultural raw materials.

The FSA, assessment helps us to determine if any removal of forest has occurred on a particular farm within the past 5 years. If deforestation has occurred, this automatically disqualifies the farm from being considered sustainable. Thus, the FSA is a critical tool to allow Ingredion to collaborate within our supply chain, identify if and where deforestation considerations occur, and address it where we find it.

Ingredion is committed to:

- Complying with applicable laws, regulations, and mandatory standards related to deforestation.
- Respecting internationally recognized human rights related to deforestation and conversion of ecosystems throughout our operations and value chains.
- Seeking and supporting the principles of Free, Prior and Informed Consent (FPIC) for Indigenous Peoples and local communities where activities may affect their rights, lands, territories, or resources.
- Achieve zero deforestation and no-conversion of natural ecosystems, or 100% sustainable use of forest-based resources, by the end of 2030.
